

Ask your child questions during reading time. Expecting your child to answer a few questions about a text will help you gauge the level of understanding. This text of *How to Make an Apple Pie* is a great passge to practice inference. Ask what the empty plate has to do with this story of the pie. Is your child able to surmise that the empty plate and crumbs mean the pie has been eaten? The ability to infer is vital to understanding most texts.


